**Died Unexpectedly At
Clarksburg Friday Morn-
ing; Will Bring Body
Here Today**

Funeral services for Miss Agnes Genevieve Garvey, 22 years old, whose sad and untimely death occurred at Clarksburg Friday morning at 6:30 o'clock, will be held Monday morning at 10 o'clock at the St. Patrick's Catholic church here.

Full particulars are not yet available, as the body has not yet been brought to this city. However it is thought that her death was caused from a weakened heart condition brought about by an illness with fever last year. Miss Garvey was ill with fever for about eight months.

Relatives and friends were shocked when a message was received Friday morning concerning her death. Since August, 1930 she had been in training at the St. Mary's hospital in Clarksburg, and it is understood that she was found dead in bed in her room at this institution.

Miss Maggie Garvey, an aunt, left Friday morning for Clarksburg to accompany the remains to this city, and is expected to return here late this afternoon.

Miss Garvey was well and favorably known here, and had hundreds of friends. She attended the local schools, and was a member of the Senior class of the Hinton High School in 1930. She was an excellent student, and took a prominent part in the activities of her school and class. She was editor and chief of the Dart, high school annual in 1930.

She was a young woman of high character, and possessed a winsome, pleasant disposition that enabled her to make many friends. She was held in the highest respect by all who knew her, and her death comes as a great shock.

Besides her father, M. A. Garvey she is also survived by one brother, Edward.
