Claude S. Davidson, Jr. 75, of Johnson St., Hinton, died 11:30 p. m. Thursday, Sept. 26, 1996, at his home following a long illness.

Born Dec. 28, 1920, in Hinton, he was the son of the late Claude S., Sr. and Maud Miller Davidson.

Mr. Davidson was a retired conductor for C&O Railway Co. with 34 years of service and retiring in 1980. He was a World War II U. S. Army veteran, having served in the Chemical Warfare Division of the South Pacific, was a member of the Mountain State Beagle Club and the United Transportation Union, was of the Presbyterian faith and was a lifelong resident of Summers County.

He was preceded in death by two brothers, John and Fred Davidson; and a sister, Mary Foster.
