Lloyd Seldomridge, 66, of Barksdale, died 1:40 a.m. Mon., May 9, 1994, at his home following a long illness.

Born Feb. 14, 1928, in Summers County, he was the son of the late Nelson and Goldie Richmond Seldomridge.

Mr. Seldomridge was a lifelong resident of Summers County, owner of the Hinton Insurance Agency and was a member of the First Presbyterian Church of Hinton where he served as past deacon, choir member and Sunday school teacher.

He was a graduate of Hinton High School, was a band member and member of the Hinton High School Football Hall of Fame.

Mr. Seldomridge was a U.S. Army veteran of the Korean Conflict, was co-founder of the Hinton Jaycees and served as president in 1961 and directed the Jaycees Ministerial from 1961 to 1969.

He was a member of the Hinton Moose Lodge No. 993, member and past exalted ruler of the Hinton Elks Lodge, co-founder and former coach of the Hinton Midget League Football and he established and was band leader of the Nu-Notes from 1968 to 1972.

He was preceded in death by a brother, Vernon Seldomridge and three sisters, Burnice Marks, Juanita Lilly and Myra Jean Seldomridge.

Survivors include his wife, Nancy Guy Seldomridge; five daughters, Linda Hartwell of Hinton, Myra Ward of Charlotte, N.C., Teresa Garcia of Falls Church, Va., Jeana Stone of Hinton and Lisa Seldomridge at home; three brothers, Leonard Seldomridge of Huntington, Eldon Seldomridge of Lynchburg, Va. and Bill Seldomridge of Hinton; three sisters, Clarice Crance of Lynchburg, Va., Evelyn Wilson of Roanoke, Va. and Norma Parks of Forest, Va., and four grandchildren,

Jonathan and Joshua Hartwell, Kimberly Bragg and Amber Stone.
