Neva M. Larson, 84 of Saline, MI passed away on Monday, August 26, 2013 at the Saline Evangelical Home after a long struggle with Parkinson's Disease.

She attended Hinton High School and received her degree in nursing from St. Francis School of Nursing in Charleston, West Virginia. She continued her education and went on to receive her Bachelor of Science in Nursing education in 1955 from Duke University in Durham, N.C.

On December 6, 1958 at the First Baptist Church in Hinton, W.VA. she married Richard W. Larson and he survives.

She continued working in nursing and in nursing education in Ann Arbor, MI while raising her son. Neva was active in many activities at Zion Lutheran Church in Ann Arbor, which included the Parish Nursing Group, SERRVE and the Zion singers. She also helped in Public school events and in the Cub Scouts. She enjoyed playing golf and she liked to travel with her husband both by auto and in their small airplane to various locations doing backpacking and building a cabin on Beaver Island, MI. Neva was a very caring wife, mother and nurse, very sharp with a good sense of humor. She fought Parkinson's Disease for over 26 years.

In addition to her husband, she is survived by her son Scott Larson and his wife Mary Ann, her sister, Lucille Bennett and nephews Randy and Rick. She was preceded in death by her brother, Robert E. Webb and sister, Hazel W. Davidson. Neva was a very caring and generous to all who knew her and she will be greatly missed by her family and friends.
