Milton G. "Footie" Foster, 77, of Hinton, died suddenly Saturday morning, April 12, 2003, at the Allegheny Regional Hospital at Low Moor, VA.

Born November 16, 1925, at Maric, he was the son of the late Oscar M. and Hattie M. Lyons Foster and had lived all of his life in Summers Co.

Mr. Foster retired after 42 1/2 years of service to the C & O Railway Co., he was a devoted member of the Miller Memorial United Methodist Church in Hinton, and served in the U.S. Navy during World War II. He was a graduate of Hinton High School and a member of the Hinton Elk's Lodge.
