J. Randolph (Boots) Quisenberry, 53, of 615 1-2 Ballangee St., Hinton, died at 7 p.m. Saturday in a Hinton hospital following a heart attack.

Born March 29, 1915 in Hinton, he was a son of the late Joseph V. and Annie Jesse Quisenberry. He was a clerk for the Chesapeake and Ohio Railway Co. for the past 23 years. He was a member of the First Christian Church, Hinton Masonic Lodge and was high priest of the Hinton Commandery and the Hinton Chapter. He was district deputy of the Order of DeMolay and a member of White Oak Lodge No. 315, Railway Clerks of America.

Surviving are his wife, Juanita Richmond Quisenberry; a son, David, Hinton; a brother, George, South Charleston; three sisters, Mrs. L. J. (Isabelle) Murphy, Cumberland, Md., Mrs. Fannie Johnson and Miss Elizabeth Quisenberry, both of Hinton.
