Katheryn L. "Snookie" Brown, 91, of 884 Club Circle Drive, Daniels, died Monday, June 30, 2003, in Raleigh General Hospital following a long illness.

Born Oct. 11, 1911, in Virginia, she was the daughter of the late William H. and Mary Calahan Linkenhoker.
