HINTON MEDICAL STUDENT IS KILLED IN CAR CRASH

Richmond, Va., Nov. 4. (AP)—J. G. Bradley, 23, of Hinton, W. Va., a student at the Virginia Medical college, was dead today following an

automobile collision here last night in which a girl and two other men were slightly injured. Bradley died soon after being admitted to a hospital.

Miss Esther Eigel, 21, of Norfolk, Va.; R. J. Cummings, 24, and J. R. Rose, 23, both of Richmond, in the car with Bradley, were only bruised and shaken up. John Anderson, negro, and lone occupant of the other machine, was arrested and charged with manslaughter. He was not hurt.

HINTON YOUTH IS KILLED IN CRASH

HINTON, W. VA., Nov. 4.—Joseph S. Bradley, 24 year old son of Mr. and Mrs. J. S. Bradley of this city, student at the medical college of Virginia who was killed in an automobile accident in Richmond last night, was a graduate from West Virginia University in last year's class. Little was known here of details of the accident which caused his death but it was understood that an automobile driven by another former Hinton young man, Robert Cummings, was "sideswiped" by another car and turned over twice on a slippery pavement.
