

Kennamae Anderson Lilly

May 22, 1920 – November 5, 2008

Kennamae Anderson Lilly, 88, of Nimitz, went home to be with the Lord, Wednesday, November 5, 2008 at the Harmony House Adult Care of Lerona, following a long illness.

Born May 22, 1920 at Jumping Branch, she was the daughter of the late Willie C. and Edna Richmond Anderson and lived her entire life in Summers Co.

She was a member of the Bluestone Baptist Church at Jumping Branch where she had served at Church Clerk, and had been a member of the choir. Kennamae was a 1938 Graduate of Hinton High School. She was a member of the Jumping Branch / Nimitz Senior Citizens and loved baking, quilting, church functions, traveling and gospel music.
