DEATH CLAIMS GLENNA HILL

A grievous blow to her family and numerous acquaintances is the death of Miss Glenna Louise Hill, who passed away Monday morning, April 18, 1932, at 10:30 o'clock, at the home of her parents, Mr. and Mrs. R. L. Hill, of Eight ave., here, aged 23 years.

Miss Hill's death was due to tuberculosis of which she had suffered for the past four years. It was her nature to bear her illness with as little complaint as possible and it was her pluck in battling the ravages of an insidious disease that no doubt prolonged her life. She was given every attention that her loved ones could bestow upon her and when the inevitable arrived their neighbors and friends feel that all was done that could have been done.

She was a graduate of the Hinton High school, class of 1927, and it was shortly thereafter that her health broke, no doubt halting a career of usefulness in the sphere that was allotted to her. She was attractive, personally, and possessed a radiating, happy disposition that made her beloved by a legion of friends.

Besides her parents, Miss Hill leaves a brother, Onva Hill who resides at home. She was a niece of Mrs. Belcher and D. E., W. J. and Giles Martin, of Hinton, and had other relatives residing here as well as elsewhere.

Funeral services will be conducted in the Central Baptist church, this (Wednesday) afternoon, at 2 o'clock, by the pastor, Rev. H. P. Hackney, assisted by Rev. V. L. King, of Covington, Va. Burial will follow in the Greenbrier Burial Park.
