Mrs. Florence E. Jackson, 71 years old, wife of the late Thomas Jackson, died Thursday afternoon at 2:15 o'clock in the Hinton hospital, afternoon at 2:15 o'clock in the Hinton Hospital, after an illness of a year and a half.

She was the former Florence Errdine Malcolm, of Kessler Cross Lanes, Nicholas county, W. Va. and was born July 24, 1873. She came to Hinton as a bride 50 years ago.

Mrs. Jackson had taught in the public schools in various counties of the state. Her most recent teaching post was in this county, where she was principal and teacher of the Riverview school of this city.

She was a member of the Ladies Auxiliary to the B. of R. T. and the Ladies Auxiliary of the O. R. C. lodges, and a life long member of the First Christian church.

Funeral services were conducted Saturday afternoon at 2:30 o'clock at the Ronald Meadows Funeral Home on Temple street, with her pastor, Rev. Arnold O. Guy officiating. Burial followed in the Hilltop cemetery.

Survivors include one daughter, Mrs. C. Thomas Sweeney, of Washington, D. C., one grandson, Lt. Frank W. Johnson, stationed with the U. S.
