Jenny was taught how to develop art pieces from fractured glass and became an artisan. She loved to travel the world and did so by land, sea and air. She farmed, milked cows, raised chickens, gardened, canned, sewed, quilted: you name it, she probably did it.

Jenny was a wife and homemaker until Matthew was a senior in high school. She worked for Dr. Camera from 1975 – 1982, until his passing. She then went to work for Attorney David Ziegler. In 1983, she set up the medical practice for her nephew Dr. Stan Day and when he opened she was hired to be his faithful and trusted office manager. Jenny's drive to be productive, to stretch her horizons and to develop her many gifts and talents never waned. She will be greatly missed by all who knew and loved her.
