DEATH CLAIMS JULIUS WEBB, MARY H. WEBB

Joint funeral rites are tentatively set for Julius C. Webb, 67, well known retired merchant who died at his home on Riverside Drive Monday at 2:30 p.m. and his wife, Mrs. Mary Haynes Webb, 63, who died suddenly today at 9:30 a.m. at her home.

Webb's funeral was scheduled to be held Thursday at 2 p.m. at the E. M. Meadows Funeral Home with the Rev. Fred Dillon in charge and it is thought that the joint rites will be held at this time. Burial will follow in the Greenbrier Burial Park.

Webb who had been ill for the past seven months, was born in Summers county, Dec. 31, 1896, a son of the late John and Ollie Baker Webb and had operated a grocery store here since 1949.

He was a member of the East Rainelle Baptist church and the A. I. O. U. W.

Surviving are two sons, John of Dover, N.J., Joe of Colonial Heights, Va.; four brothers, Robert, Fred and Ira Webb of Hinton and Dempsey Webb of Pipestem; a sister, Mrs. Grace Hannah of Hinton and five granddaughters.

Mrs. Mary Webb was born at Haynes Ferry, May 13, 1900, a daughter of the late H. G. Haynes and Mrs. Molly Vermillion Haynes who resides with another daughter, Mrs. Tyler Webb in Bellepoint.

She graduated from Hinton High School in 1920, attended Marshall College and taught school. She was married to Julius Webb in 1927.

Survivors in addition to two sons and her mother and grandchildren mentioned above include a brother, Elmond Haynes and a sister, Mrs. Tyler Webb.

The bodies are at the E. M. Meadows Funeral Home on Park Avenue where friends may call after 11 a.m. Wednesday.
