Galdwyn A. Cales, 80, of 307 Challenge St., Hinton, died Tues., Jan. 7, 1997, in a Hinton hospital following long illness.

Born Jan. 20, 1916, in Green Sulphur Springs, he was the son of the late E. L. and Irene Ford Cales.

Mr. Cales was a 1934 graduate of Hinton High School and West Virginia University with a Bachelor of Science degree in engineering and was a former engineer for Bethlehem Steel Corp., Hull, Mass.

He was retired from the Naval Sea System Command with the Department of the Navy and was the recipient of several honorable merits with the U. S. Navy under the direction of Vice Admiral William Rowden, for service engineering of missiles installed on aircraft carriers and destroyers. He moved back to Hinton upon his retirement.

He was preceded in death by his wife, Hope Barnes Cales on Nov. 5, 1996.

Survivors include a sister, Mary Caldwell of Hinton; a nephew Tommy Mac Mazzella of South Charleston; and a niece, Karen Williams of Wellsburg.

Joint memorial services were held at 3 p. m. Fri., Jan. 10th. at Pivont Funeral Home Chapel, Hinton, with the Rev. Elmo Alderman officiating. Burial will follow at a later date in Greenbrier Burial Park.
