Mrs. Kloris Ann Dressler McCormick, 59, of Hinton, died Thurs., Aug. 10, 1995, in a Beckley hospital, following a long illness.

Born Feb. 20, 1936, at Hinton, she was the daughter of Virginia C. Dressler and the late William E. Dressler.

Mrs. McCormick was a 1954 Valedictorian graduate of Hinton High School, receiving her AB Degree Magna Cum Laude from Marshall University and her PhD. from West Virginia University.

She taught Latin and English at Hinton High School from 1958 to 1973 and as a Fulbright Scholar she taught English at Anatolia College in Thessalonika, Greece. She dedicated her professional life to the revival of the teaching of Latin in the public schools.

Mrs. McCormick was a member of the United Methodist Church at Hinton and the Addie Cooch Sunday School Class.

She was preceded in death by her husband, Lt. Col. John McCormick.

Other survivors include a brother, Dr. William C. Dressler of Martinsburg; a sister, Jean Beasley of Athens; six nieces; and three nephews.

Services were held at 1:30 p.m. Sun. Aug. 13 at Ronald Meadows Funeral Parlor Chapel with Pastor Eileen Schneider and Harry Pilkington officiating. Burial followed in the Restwood Memorial Gardens of Hinton.
