Local Young Woman Dies At Charleston

A death that came with extreme grief to her many surviving relatives and friends of this city, was that of Mrs. Walter Goodwin, of Jochin, who died at the St. Francis hospital at Charleston early last night from a illness of complications from which she had suffered for several weeks.

Mrs. Goodman was formerly Miss Margaret Cutts of this city, and the oldest daughter of Mr. and Mrs. W. A. Cutts, of Temple street. She was one of Hinton's most highly accomplished young ladies, and a graduate of the Hinton High School a few years ago. Later she entered the Chicago university where she spent two years taking preparatory work. Mrs. Goodwin left Hinton about four year ago and was teaching at Jochin where she met Mr. Goodwin and was married early last spring.

Besides her husband and parents, the deceased is survived by two brothers, Joseph Cutts, a student, at Notre Dame university, Charles, of Hinton; three sisters, Misses Elizabeth, Alice and Ernestine, all of the home.

The remains of the deceased were brought to Hinton this morning on No. 4 accompanied by the husband and parents, and taken to the Cutts home. Funeral services will be conducted from St. Patrick's church, Friday morning at ten o'clock by Father E. F. Jenkins and the remains will be laid to rest at the St. Mary's cemetery.

Mrs. Goodwin was 24 years of age.
