LEWISBURG — Dr. William S. Coleman Sr., 86, formerly of Hinton, died Friday, April 28, at a Fairlea care center following a long illness.

Born Aug. 28, 1902, in Lynchburg, Va., he was the son of the late George and Betty Spencer Coleman.

Dr. Coleman was a graduate of the Medical College of Richmond, Va., had been a resident of Lewisburg for more than 50 years and was a member of the Old Stone Presbyterian Church, where he was ruling elder emeritus.

He was past-potentate of the Beni Kedem Shrine, member of the Masonic Lodge, past-president of Rotary, member of the Chamber of Commerce, served as mayor of Lewisburg from 1961-1972, owned and operated Coleman's Pharmacy for more than 50 years and was a retired pharmacist.

He was preceded in death by his wife, Ethel W. Coleman, in 1971.

Survivors include a daughter, Mary C. Scarborough of Lewisburg; three sons, James K. and William S. Coleman Jr., both of Lewisburg and John W. Coleman of Laurel, Md.; two sisters, Jean Carson and Virginia Light, both of New York; two brothers, Howard L. Coleman of Lewisburg and Charles E. Coleman of Alderson; nine grandchildren, and four great-grandchildren.

Services will be at 2 p.m. Sunday at the Old Stone Presbyterian Church with Dr. Davis Yuell officiating. Burial will be in the Rosewood Cemetery at Lewis-

burg, with masonic graveside rites.
