Former Hinton Mayor "Bill" Dressler Dies

William E. (Bill) Dressler, 75, of 1323 Temple Street, died Sun. Dec. 31, at 1:37 a.m. at the Bluefield Regional Medical Center following a long illness.

Born May 27, 1914 at Hinton, he was the son of the late Charles J. and Lottie Briers Dressler.

Mr. Dressler was a lifelong resident of Hinton, a retired chief clerk for the C & O Railroad Company in 1974, a member of the B.R.A.C., a member of the Hinton Kiwanis Club, and a member of the River-view Chapel in Hinton. He also served as past president of the Summers County Senior Citizens and Summers County Historical Society, also serving as Mayor of Hinton from 1971 to 1973, and as city councilman for ten years.

Survivors include his wife, Virginia C. Neely Dressler; a son, Dr.

William Conrad Dressler of Martinsburg; two daughters, Dr. Kloris Ann McCormick of Hinton and Jean Karen Beasley of Athens, and nine grandchildren.

Services will be today, Jan 2, at 2:30 p.m. at the Ronald Meadows Funeral Parlor Chapel in Hinton with Harry Pilkington and the Rev. Donald Hannah officiating. Burial will follow in the Restwood Memorial Gardens at Hinton.
