James A. “Jack” Wallace, 89, of 108 Pleasant St., died 4 p.m. Tues., Apr. 12, 1994, in a Hinton hospital following a long illness.

Born Oct. 3, 1904, at Lowell, he was the son of the late James M. and Arminta Jane Manning Wallace.

Mr. Wallace was a lifelong resident of Summers County, was a retired yard master for the C&O

Railroad with 44 years of service and was a member of the First Presbyterian Church of Hinton and the Talcott Masonic Lodge No. 100 AF and AM.

He served two terms on the Summers County Commission, was a former member of the Hinton City Council and was a former chairman of the Summers County Democratic Executive Committee.

He was preceded in death by his first wife, Betty Fields Wallace; four brothers, Edgar, Bob, John William and Hubert Wallace; two sisters, Mary Hellems and Annie Lowe and a grandson, George Andrew Miller.

Survivors include his wife of 57 years, Mary Rose Hobbs Wallace; three daughters, Judith Miller of Carlisle, Oh., Karen Bennett of Middletown, Oh. and Kathy Harvey of Talcott; a son, John Wallace of Street, Md.; two sisters, Nellie Miller and Lula Hume, both of Hinton; 11 grandchildren, and one great-granddaughter.

Services were held at 11 a.m. Fri. Apr. 15 at the First Presbyterian Church, Hinton with Rev. Robert Glaser and Chaplain Dean Veltman officiating. Burial followed in the Greenbrier Burial Park, Hinton.

The body was at the Ronald Meadows Funeral Parlors, Hinton and on Fri. at 10:00 a.m. at the church.

Talcott Masonic Lodge served as pallbearers and conducted graveside rites.
