## Rev. Dwight E. Harris

## February 2, 1901 – May 22, 1991

Rev. Dwight E. Harris, 90, died Wed. May 22, at his home following a long illness.

Born Feb. 2, 1901 in Fort Recovery, OH, he was the son of the late Rev. John W. and Lula P. Harris.

Rev. Harris was a graduate of God's Bible School and College in Cincinnati, OH in 1921. He later studied at Concord College, Athens and in 1922 he entered the Postal Service at Hinton, serving as a letter carrier, retiring in 1958.

He also served as Pastor for the Hinton Gospel Tabernacle, Mt. Olivet Church at Madams Creek and the Mount Hope Christian Nation Church.

Rev. Harris was a member of the Hinton Ministerial Association for several years and was selected as president of the Association during this period.

He was preceded in death by his first wife, Mary V. Harris, in Jan. 1950 and a brother, Samuel Harris, in June 1973.

Survivors include five sons, John M. Harris of Spokane, WA, James E. Harris of Liverpool, NY, Dwight Joseph Harris of Chester, SC, Daniel E. and David N. at home; two daughters, Grace E. Harris of Taiwan and Naomi Ruth Harris at home; two brothers, John N. Harris of Boston, MA, and Paul J. Harris of Asheville, NC; a sister Mrs. Clarence (Lois) Ratcliffe of Toccoa, GA; five grandchildren and one great-grandchild.

Services were held at 2:30p.m. Sat., May 24 at the Ronald Meadows Funeral Parlor Chapel, Hinton, with Rev. Elmo Alderman officiating. Burial followed in the Greenbrier Burial Park near Hinton.
