Last Rites Held for Ray Quisenberry

Ray W. Quisenberry, 44, a former resident of this city, died suddenly Monday morning of a heart attack at his home in Chicago. Apparently in the best of health his death came as a shock to his family and friends.

The son of the late Mr. and Mrs. J. Vivian Quisenberry, he was born in Hinton, October 1, 1898. He was graduated from the Hinton High school with the class of 1917, after which he attended the University of West Virginia, and the University of Chicago. After his graduation from the latter institution, he was employed as a teacher in the Hinton High school. He went to Chicago about twenty years ago as an executive in the order of the Boys Scouts of America. At the time of his death he held the position of supervisor of parks for the federal government.

Mr. Quisenberry was married, his wife, the former Miss Ruth Jones, and little daughter, Jean Anne, surviving him. He leaves two sisters here, Miss Elizabeth Quisenberry and Mrs. Fannie Johnson and one brother, James Quisenberry; his younger sister, Mrs. L. J. Murphy, resides in Cumberland, Md., and his two brothers, George and Randolph Quisenberry live in Charleston.

Funeral services were scheduled for this (Wednesday) afternoon, followed by burial in Chicago.
