Mrs. Carrie Boland Dies in Charleston

Mrs. Carrie Vermillion Boland wife of Charles Boland, and a former resident of this city, died at the Hill Crest sanitarium in Charleston, on Saturday evening, at 6:20

A message was received here by her relatives soon after her death on Saturday and arrangements were made to bring the body here for burial. Accompanied by a number of relatives, they arrived here on Sunday night and were taken to the home of her aunt, Mrs. J. B. F. Grimmitt, of Ballengee Street, and on Tuesday the funeral services will be conducted from that home, at 11 a. m. by Revs. Yates and Hackney, after which the remains will be laid to rest at the Hill Top Cemetery.

Mrs. Boland was a daughter of Dr. and Mrs. John Vermillion of Athens, but she had made her home with her aunt, Mrs. Grimmitt nearly all her life, and was known to many people of this city. Soon after her marriage to Mr. Boland, they moved to Charleston, where they have resided for the past two or more years.

She graduated from the Hinton High School in 1912 and attended the University in 1913 and 1914. Mrs. Boland was well educated and a lady much loved and respected by her acquaintances.

She had been in poor health and contracted influenza and later pneumonia, which with other complications, resulted in her death.
