James H. Stewart, 89, of Logan, Ohio, passed away Saturday, Jan. 22, 2011, at Logan Health Care Center.

He was born June 7, 1921, in Hinton, W.Va., son of the late Charles Manly and Daisy Nelson Stewart.

Jimmy was married to Mary Lou Fralick Stewart, who survives.

He retired from Rockwell International in Columbus and was a member of Immanuel United Methodist Church in Logan. Jimmy played on the first West Virginia State High School Football Championship team in 1938 and worked for C&O Railroad in Hinton and Logan.

He was on Logan City Council for 24 years and was on the Logan Planning Commission.
