Joseph Clay Charlton Sr., 85, of Salem, Va., passed away on Sunday, January 11, 2009.

Joseph served our country in the United States Air Force from 1943 to 1969. He was drafted into the Army Air Corp in England on February of 1943. After retiring from the service, he began his employment with the USPS in Salem from 1970 until his retirement in 1988.
