William H. Musgrave Sr., 62, of 5135 Kentucky Street, South Charleston, was found dead in his car at Lewis and Dickinson Streets of an apparent self - inflicted gunshot wound September 5, 1988, said Sgt. Dallas Staples of the Charleston Police Department.

The body was taken to the state medical examiner's office in South Charleston.

He was a retired supervisor with Union Carbide. He was a member of the First Baptist Church, South Charleston. He was a Navy veteran of World War II. He was a native of Kentucky and had lived in South Charleston for 37 years.

Surviving: wife, Joyce Breen Musgrave; sons, William H. "Skip" Jr. of South Charleston, Tom of South Charleston, daughters, Jenny Wolford of Hurricane, Lisa Keeling of South Charleston; mother, Mrs. Virginia P. Musgrave of Hurricane; brother, Don of St. Albans; nine grandchildren.

There was a private family service. Burial followed in the Cunningham Memorial Park at St. Albans. The body was at the Good Shepherd Mortuary in South Charleston.
